Double Wing Recipes

Tier's note: Be sure to use BT's Double Magic Dubbing or Touch-A Tron Dubbing or LaFontaine's Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing. It's important to use Gary's touch method to apply the material outlined in our book "A Dozen Dubbing Techniques" in the chapter about touch dubbing techniques starting on page 55. The BT's dubbing brands are available at www.btsflyfishing.com and the LaFontaine dubbing is available at www.thebookmailer.com.

Tying suggestion: Gary originally tied this fly on a 1x long dry fly hook. Quite frankly it is difficult to get all of the materials on a hook that short so Gretchen and I often tie it on a 2x long dry fly hook or a 3x long curved hook similar to a TMC 200R.

Lime Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or lime) Tail: Antron yarn, lime Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed lime green

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, lime

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, grizzly dyed olive

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Grizzly (or grizzly dyed olive)

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: An excellent pattern around vegetation – plants reflect a lot of green

light.

Orange Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or orange) Tail: Antron yarn, burnt orange

Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed brown

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, burnt or

regular orange

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, brown Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Grizzly Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: For dusk when there is a magnificent reddish-orange sunset.

Gray Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or gray)

Tail: Antron yarn, dark gray

Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed rusty or regular orange

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, dark gray

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, Cree, dark barred ginger, or bleached grizzly

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Grizzly Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: Use this pattern on a dark overcast and rainy day.

Yellow Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or yellow) Tail: Antron yarn, yellow Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, pale or regular yellow

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, yellow

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, Cree, golden badger

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Grizzly Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: Midday attractor – also valuable as an imitation of certain yellow

stoneflies (especially the #16 Yellow Sallies and the #8 Golden Stones).

Royal Double Wing ("Enchanted" version in our book, Tying Hair-Wing Flies on page 93)

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or red)

Tail: Antron yarn, bright green (not lime)

Tip/Tag: Floss, red

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed brown

Body: Peacock herl

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, brown or Coachman brown

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Brown or Coachman brown

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: The ultimate attractor – contains green, red, and brown highlight and

works on riffles during midday as an all-around searching/attractor

Midnight Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly

Thread: 6/0 (black)

Tail: Antron yarn, dark gray Tip/Tag: Floss, gray or black Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, black Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, black

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, black Front Wing: Calf body or tail, black, stacked

Hackle: Black Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: A black fly for night fishing. The silhouette shows up against the night

sky.

Charm Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or dark blue) Tail: Antron yarn, kingfisher blue Tip/Tag: Floss, kingfisher blue Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, natural

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, twilight

blue

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, blue or brown

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Blue or brown

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: This is the pattern for the last moments of dusk after the sun sets. That's

when the light tends to take on a bluish quality.

Pink Lady Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or pink) Tail: Antron yarn, pink or red

Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, natural

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, pink

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, grizzly or grizzly dyed light pink

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked Hackle: Grizzly or grizzly dyed light pink

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: Pink for when the light is pink – late morning and late afternoons.

White Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or white) Tail: Antron yarn, white Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, white

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, white

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, white or light grizzly

Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: White or light grizzly

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: This is also a good fly for late, evenings, mainly because it reflects all of

the available light and it also makes a good moth imitation.

Brown Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or brown) Tail: Antron yarn, brown Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed brown

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, brown

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, brown Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Brown Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: This is the in-between fly – use this pattern right in between the

afternoon and evening. It's a warm fly but not super warm.

Cream Double Wing

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or tan) Tail: Antron yarn, tan or white

Tip/Tag: Floss, white

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, dyed tan

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, tan

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, ginger Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Ginger Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: Another fine moth imitation; also one of my favorite very early morning patterns. Use this fly at dawn.

Lady Heather Double Wing (from our LaFontaine Legacy Flies book on Amazon on page 110)

Hook: Size 8-20, 1xL dry fly Thread: 6/0 (black or gray) Tail: Antron yarn, light gray

Tip/Tag: Floss, gray

Rear Wing: Elk or deer hair, natural (black felt-tip pen, barred markings)

Body: LaFontaine Quick Fingers Touch Dubbing, BT's Double Magic or Touch-A Tron, cream

Body Hackle: Trimmed top & bottom, grizzly Front Wing: Calf body or tail, white, stacked

Hackle: Grizzly

Head: Thread

Gary's suggested use: This is a great attractor for those days that photographers call "cloudy bright." Cloud cover everything, but there is enough light coming through so that everything isn't a dark gray. Author's note: Gretchen and I have also found this pattern very effective in a couple of "tight" canyons we like to fish where the light is not directly on the stream except for a very short time during part of the day.
